

North Hennepin Community College Transfer Guide

The following courses at **North Hennepin Community College** are recommended as general education requirements for an efficient transfer process into **Concordia University, St. Paul**. This transfer guide applies to students who intend to enter one of Concordia's traditional daytime on campus programs. Aside from this guide, the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum and Liberal Arts Associate of Arts degrees are fully accepted as completion of general education requirements with the addition of two Concordia religion courses.

Concordia University, St. Paul welcomes and encourages students to apply for admission for both fall and spring semesters.

Does Concordia accept the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum?

Yes! Transfer students who have completed the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum or a Liberal Arts Associate of Arts degree from an accredited institution are considered to have met Concordia's general education requirements with the exception of two religion classes (8 credits.)

What are the admission requirements?

- Minimum 2.00 cumulative grade point average
- Letter of recommendation from the dean of students of the college or university you last attended
- Official transcripts from all colleges or universities you have attended

What merit scholarships and grants are available?

Eligible transfer students are awarded between \$2,500 and \$6,000 (renewable for three additional years) at the time of admission. A transfer student who receives this award must also attend full-time, be degree-seeking, and have completed 20 semester credits prior to entering Concordia. The national scholarship deadline is May 1st. In addition, Concordia University strongly encourages students to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to be considered for institutional, state and federal grants.

Will I need to submit high school transcripts or ACT scores?

Transfer students with 20 or more college credits are not required to submit high school transcripts, ACT or SAT scores.

What are the most popular areas of study at Concordia University?

Concordia's most popular areas of study in our traditional programs are business, education, communication, church work, psychology, theater and science majors. Concordia also offers a variety of educational options for individuals looking to complete BA degrees in an accelerated evening or online format. These programs can take a little as 16–22 months to complete; attending class one night per week.
