Guidelines:

- Each application must include this completed form, an audition (live or mailed-in CD, DVD, video or audio tape) and two letters of recommendation from persons familiar with your musical ability.
- You can schedule your 15-minute live audition/interview at Concordia January 30, February 6 or 13 2009, 3:00-6:00 p.m. **Call 651-641-8248** to schedule your appointment. Concordia can provide an accompanist for your audition; a copy of your music must be received a week in advance.
- For the audition, it is best to do two contrasting pieces; total length of the audition pieces should be at least 4 but no more than 8 minutes. Music performed should be classical contest-level material. Singers will also be asked to vocalize from the middle of their range to their top and bottom; instrumentalists will play two scales of their choice.
- If excessive distance from the university prohibits a live audition, a recording may be submitted.
- First priority for scholarships will be given to applications received by your scheduled audition date (**February 13 is the priority deadline** for consideration if a recorded audition is mailed in.)
- To be considered for music scholarships, students must:
 - Already be accepted for admission to Concordia, St. Paul with deposit paid.
 - Have a financial aid estimator form on file at Concordia.
 - Must be enrolled in 2009-2010 as a full-time traditional undergraduate student at Concordia.
- Award amounts vary depending on audition quality, recommendations, academic strength, financial need, and program of study.
- Recipients are expected to enroll in a major choral and/or instrumental ensemble of the university for the entire academic year.
- Some awards may be renewable; students may also become eligible for designated upper class scholarships in their subsequent years at Concordia.
