

TEACH GRANT APPLICATION 2021-2022

The TEACH Grant provides up to a maximum yearly amount of \$4,000 in grants to students who agree to serve as full-time teachers in a high-need field in a public or private elementary or secondary school that serves students from low-income families. Currently, the annual maximum is slightly less than \$4,000 due to federal sequestration. The lifetime eligibility cumulative limit for the TEACH Grant is \$8,000. Post- baccalaureate students are not eligible to participate in the TEACH Grant Program at Concordia University.

IMPORTANT

If the service commitment is not fulfilled, the grant is permanently converted to a Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan to be repaid by the recipient with interest accruing from the time of the grant disbursement.
