- Cohort format with small class sizes for optimal engagement with faculty and peers
- The Clinical Applications Diploma at Century must be completed prior to starting CSP's CAAHEP-accredited MSOP program, unless a student is pursuing dual enrollment; in this case, the 1000-level OPCA coursework must be completed and the 2000-level coursework will be taken while enrolled in the MSOP program.
- Concordia University, St. Paul and Century College have their own university admissions standards. These standards must be met in addition to the prerequisite coursework, in order to pursue the MS, Orthotics and Prosthetics degree. Admission to the MSOP program is not guaranteed.
- Upon conferral of the MSOP degree, students are required to complete an NCOPE-approved residency.

### **STUDENTS WITH A PREVIOUS BACHELOR'S DEGREE (2 OPTIONS)**

  - **Step 2:** Complete 1000-level OPCA coursework at Century College (*unless waived due to prior experience*).

- **Step 3:** Complete the O & P Clinical Applications Diploma at Century College.
- Step 4: Apply to MSOP program at CSP.
  Deadline is August 1st.

**OPTION 2: DUAL ENROLLMENT** 

**Step 1:** Complete Bachelor's Degree at a regionally accredited institution.

- **Step 2:** Complete 1000-level OPCA coursework at Century College (*unless waived due to prior experience*).
  - Coursework starts year-round.
  - Complete 6 specific prerequisite courses either during undergraduate degree or while at Century College.
- **Step 3:** Complete 2000-level OPCA Coursework at Century College and first year of MSOP coursework at CSP.
  - Courses begin each Fall semester.
  - Application deadline for the Clinical Applications program is April each year.
  - Apply to MSOP program once accepted into OPCA program.
  - MSOP Deadline is August 1st.
  - **Step 4:** Complete last year of MSOP coursework at CSP.
